My name is John Wade and I am standing as the Conservative Party candidate for the Glascote ward in the upcoming elections in May.



Investing in infrastructure

Under the stewardship of local Conservatives, Tamworth Borough Council has recently secured £21.65m worth of funding through the Future High Streets Fund. Plans are already afoot to use this money to rebuild a town centre that is fit for the 21st Century.

In addition to this, a consultation into the future use of the old Gungate precinct was launched in early 2021, seeking the views of all residents on Tamworth. How these two projects complement each other will be vital to the survival of the town centre in future years. A Conservative led Council will ensure that the redevelopment of our town centre is in good hands.



Supporting local businesses

One of the fundamental beliefs of Tamworth Conservatives is that the local, independent businesses are the lifeblood of our town. We will support these businesses as they recover from the impact of the coronavirus, supporting and rewarding the entrepreneurs that make our town the fantastic place it is.

£375k has been allocated for major works in the Castle Grounds which will see a new, modern play park with additional benches and amenities situated within the grounds.

Local Conservatives will ensure the council regularly reviews our open spaces and parks to see how these can be improved and have more of an impact for the betterment of our communities.



Protecting our environment

Tamworth Conservatives are working hard to tackle fly-tippers. This illegal dumping blights our communities, destroys our environment, and we want to stop them. Using all the tools available, a Conservative run Council will keep the spotlight firmly on these waste criminals, investigating every occurrence and prosecuting offenders, fully.

The cleanliness of the A5 is also a concern, with increased amounts of rubbish and waste being found on the side of the road.
